

As a former member of the Armed Services, your commitment to your country is greatly honored by the Youth Resiliency Institute. Thank you for your time, bravery, and sacrifice for this country. Your strength also helped to lay a strong foundation in historic Cherry Hill. As you are aware, Cherry Hill was established as a community for GI's returning from WWII and Korea. This location was selected after several other options were opposed by whites who did not want African Americans moving too close to their neighborhoods. As such, we'd like to publicly recognize you during this year's in-person Cherry Hill Arts & Music Waterfront Festival to be held on July 4th in Middle Branch Park. FESTIVAL BACKGROUND

The Cherry Hill Arts & Music Waterfront Festival is managed by the Youth Resiliency Institute (an organization under the umbrella of Fusion Partnerships, Inc). For over twelve years, YRI has been developing, researching, implementing and evaluating culturally responsive community arts in historic Cherry Hill. The festival was co-founded by great grandmother, artist and Cherry Hill resident Ms. Shirley Foulks and Youth Resiliency Institute executive director and cultural arts organizer Fanon Hill.

The Cherry Hill Arts & Music Waterfront Festival has quickly become one of the East Coast's premiere waterfront festivals. In July 2019, we hosted more than 5,000 attendees. You can learn more about the festival here: cherryhillfest.com.
